Thanks to all of a participating churches and volunteers, with just the electric assistance program, 1,119 households did not have to go without electricity in their homes this year. Today, these families are warm and safe.

I recently helped families who were in need of food, clothing and rental assistance. One family who stands out is Virginia (elderly grandmother raising her 2 granddaughters). During that time, she was able to get her water turned back on (leaky faucet caused the increase) and take better care of her grandchildren. Without your help, Virginia and her grandchildren would still be without water. On behalf of them, thank you.



Love Inc of Greater Akron is entering into its tenth year helping families in need pay electric bills. In partnership with **Ohio Edison**, Love Inc over the past ten years have administered the Ohio Fuel Fund program. Just this past October 2016, over \$28,000 was credited to accounts for 186 families (558 children under the age of 6) and 372 children ages 7-18 were assisted with their electric. Volunteers from ten local churches provided this mission outreach.
